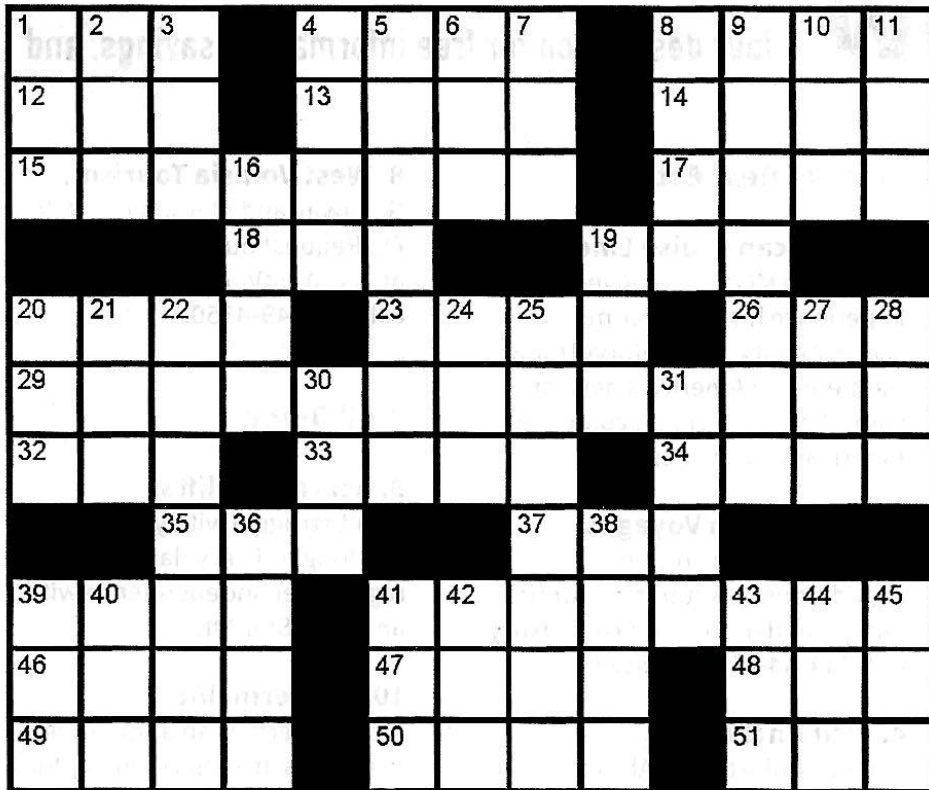

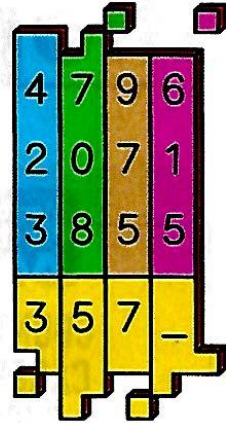

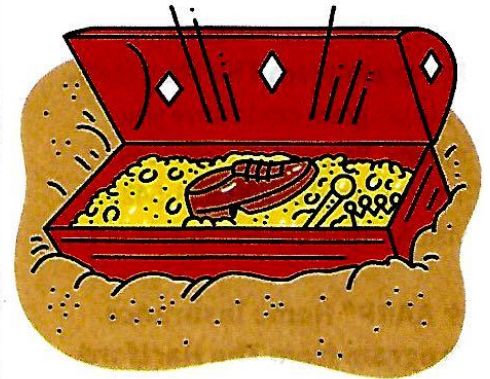
Each of the three digits below the line relates to the numbers directly above it. What number belongs in the blank space?

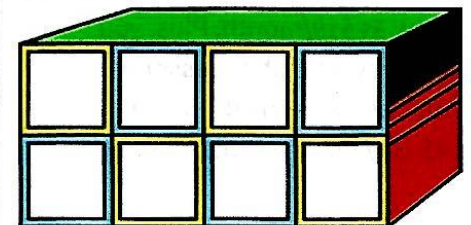
