Installation of the photo sensor that will control the pool cover opening and closing has been approved. It will cost \$1500 and will be installed by Sims Electric sometime around the third week in March.

Day or Night Electric will add a circuit to the area where three coffee pots are plugged in at times in the kitchen. Their bid was \$500 and has been approved.

The wooden fence east and south of our property is in bad shape after many years. Dave will meet with Pacific Northwest Fence to talk about replacing the old fence with galvanized fencing at 5 or 6 ft. They will give Dave a bid at that time.

The road to the back of the clubhouse needs to be replaced. Knife River gave us a bid last year of \$63,000. Dave has calls in for bids from Black Pearl and Carson Paving. The cracks in the roads that need to be filled will be addressed in the near future.

The hillsides below lots 61-64 needs brush removal, as it is a fire hazard. Bids are at \$3200 and \$5700. Approval for the job is for \$3200.

Doug Myers' case is settled. Our insurance will pay the settlement. In addition, we are required to post a Fair Housing Act (FHA) notice at the gate and the Board members will be required to attend FHA training.

Recommended changes to the CC&Rs will soon be sent out for review and approval by the community.

Preparation for elections have begun. **Volunteers are needed to help.**

The annual meeting is set for May 21, 2023 at 2 p.m.
