A judgement against the property owners was entered by the Douglas County Circuit Court ordering the owners/occupants to remove all of the solid waste and vacate the property within 30 days.

The occupants of the property were served copies of the notice yesterday.

If the owners/occupants fail to clean up and vacate the property, the court will hold them in contempt and the county will seek a court order authorizing a cleanup at their expense.

Unfortunately the administrative and court process takes time and we are working as quickly as possible to resolve this case.
